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A FATHER'S HEART BEATS FOR OTHERS

Each June we recognize and honor fatherhood. As we look about us, we can usually find a man who seems to have a certain grace and strength about him that attracts nearly everyone.

At MCRC we happily have found such a man; his name is **Ihsan Taqi**. Ihsan, age 65, and his wife, arrived in Erie as refugees from Iraq about ten months ago. Their long journey began a few years earlier as they fled the danger and violence that had become day-to-day reality of their country. Their struggle to find safety first took them to Turkey where they stayed with their three daughters and grandchildren for two years. During that time, they were not permitted to work, own property, or live their lives as their citizen neighbors could. Furthermore the risk of being sent back to Iraq by the Turkish government was an ever-lingering fear.

In July of 2011, Ihsan received the news that he and his wife, but not his children or grandchild-

ren, had been accepted for refugee resettlement in the United States. Per-

suaed to do so by his daughters who wanted to see their parents live safe and stable lives, he accepted resettlement.

Ihsan arrived in Erie eager to find work, but he soon discovered the reality that a 65 year old man with little English and no American job history has little hope of finding employment in our struggling economy. In a short time, he found his way to MCRC where he attends various English classes and meets with Imad Diab, our Iraqi refugee case manager, for assistance. Ihsan al-

ways greets staff with a kind smile, and he takes every opportunity to express his thanks to America and its citizens for the new beginnings his countrymen and -women have been given. On one occasion, Ihsan presented a beautiful poster that he made to MCRC, and we proudly display it in our central lobby. The work represents his gratitude to America, and his shared belief in our values and freedoms.

Very recently, Ihsan was approached by an MCRC staff member who noticed that he appeared sad and unlike himself. As they talked, Ihsan shared that he could no longer stay in America and expressed a strong feeling that he should return to Iraq. He went on to explain that he was an old man who had lived a long life and that he had no right to be in such a great country when children in his country were dying violently every day. His reasoning was to exchange places to give a child an opportunity to live freely and safely in America.

Amicucci, MCRC Director of Education presented the students for diplomas. The theme of the evening was "Moving Forward," and Student Speaker for the Multicultural Center **Nirmal Gurung** gave an inspiring message that included a narrative of his own journey forward. "Walking through the forest in heavy rain was almost a death sentence," he said, as he described his own journey of escape from oppression, resettlement in the U.S., moving to Erie, finding support at MCRC, helping others as a caseworker, and now completing this educational milestone.

MCRC Leads Job Development Program at John E. Horan Garden Apartment Community

On November 1, 2011, MCRC began fulfilling the activities of the **John E. Horan Garden Apartment's Job Development Program**, through a one year contract with the Housing Authority of the City of Erie. The program involves helping residents of the Garden Apartments and the Bird Drive Apartments find employment and develop the skills needed to make them successful in finding and sustaining meaningful employment. Our services include job search, resume' preparation, case management support, GED and ESL classes. Approximately 40 percent of the residents converse with English-as-a-Second Language, with the remainder of residents coming from the general population of Erie.

With job development being such a big part of the MCRC agenda, the John E. Horan Garden Apartment program was a natural. Our job developers have been able to link-up with our temporary employment service, **MOSAICO** Employment, as well as connect with our employment specialists at the main center, to help find employment opportunities for participants in the program. All services are provided in the Learning Center, at the J.E. Horan Garden Apartments, under the direction of long-term MCRC staff person, **Isela Abreu-Arce**. MCRC is excited to have this opportunity and challenge.

JumpStart Success Serves Young Adults in Career Exploration, Job Development

In June, 2012, MCRC added the **JumpStart Success** program to its activities at the John E. Horan Garden Apartments. JumpStart Success is funded through the JEHGA Job Development contract and a grant from Career Links. JumpStart Success is a job readiness and career exploration program

designed to work with young people, 16 to 21 years of age. "Our goal is to help the young people we serve find a 'vision' of what career opportunities are available to them and support their efforts to fulfill these visions," said Dr. Al Turner, Dir. Of Client Services.

The program, developed in Pittsburgh by YouthWorks, Inc., provides an educational curriculum designed to help young people engage the work world with the skills and knowledge necessary to be successful. In addition to the classroom-based coursework, students will participate in leadership building and community awareness activities. "We want this to be fun and interesting, as well as educational. We even have plans to help participants travel to Niagara Falls, Pittsburgh and Cleveland," Turner said. Any 16 – 21 year old resident of Section 8 Housing or a Housing Authority property, is eligible to participate.
